Those of you who have visited the Center in recent months were able to enjoy spacious private parking for the first time in the Center's 80 year history! Thanks to substantial grants from the state and county we were able to acquire the properties adjacent to the Center last year and remove several dilapidated buildings to make way for the new parking area. In the years ahead we are planning other expansion projects to serve you better.

To spur these new developments we've been more focused than ever on strategic planning initiatives. Early in 2012 we conducted a survey of over 500 members and constituents. The results provided us with valuable feedback and ideas for new programming. To that end, we have restructured our organization, appointed several new officers and created new board committees to carry out our goals. After 17 years as President of the BMNECC, I have decided to step down from running the day-to-day operations of the Center. As Chairwoman Emerita, I will remain active in fundraising activities and major events. My tenure as BMNECC President has provided me with some of the most rewarding experiences of my life, and I thank all who have supported me through the years.

Our new President is Ken Service, a 17-year board member who has chaired the Finance and Capital Campaign committees for many years. He has a long history as a public relations manager for area universities and corporations and is currently Executive Director of the Pittsburgh Council on Higher Education. Edward Markoff is Vice President of Operations. Ed, a retired Alcoa executive, was President of the Bulgarian Macedonian Beneficial Association (BMBA) for 10 years and has been an active BMNECC board member and officer for 17 years. Polina Hristozova, a native of Bulgaria, is Vice President of Membership and Development. A Development DBA for UPMC, Polina has served on the board for five years. Don Ickert continues in his role as Treasurer. Don, a partner in the Bates, Barksdale, Ickert and Company accounting firm, has served on the board for five years. Long-time board member Angel Roy continues as Secretary. She is an Inside Sales Manager at Triumph Interiors and has managed our Soup Segal program since its inception in 1999. After 14 years of performing with numerous bands she launched a successful solo career in 1997 and has released 9 studio albums since that time. She's performed in a dozen major American cities, including Los Angeles, Dallas, Las Vegas, Boston and Chicago. We were pleased to be able to host Ms. Boeva's Pittsburgh debut concert!
